



Benefits of a Shelter Coalition

- Like minded organizations all working towards the same goal
- Define your goal and mission from the get go!
- Start small, and grow as you gain footing.
- Define immediate goals and get to work!
- Record all your data so you can get grant funding as well as have an idea what areas need the most help



Pets for Life and Outreach Work

- Getting out into the community gives you a first hand look at what your community struggles are
- Start in the neighborhoods where you are getting the most phone calls
- Keeping pets in homes means less overcrowding in your shelters and less financial stress
- Have a non judgmental approach so you can build long term relationships and communities gain trust
